What's New?

In the near future will be implementing an online appointment booking system. Until we work out some of the kinks we will be gently integrating the new system into the practice only allowing for a limited number of appointments that can be booked on line. The next time you are in the clinic please ensure we have your correct personal information (i.e., address, direct contact phone number and email address.)

What is a Locum?

A locum is a fully qualified doctor who has completed all of their family medicine training. They are hired by the clinic to replace a vacationing physician (like a substitute teacher). A locum may be covering your physician's practice for a day, a week or several weeks. They are available to see you while your doctor is away. This ensures that your medical needs are dealt with in a timely manner even though your doctor may be away from the office.

What is a Resident?

A resident is a recently graduated doctor who has completed medical school and is getting family medicine specific training for a two year period before working independently. Our physicians often supervise residents from McMaster so you may be asked to see a resident when calling for an
